BY-LAWS VILLAGE OF PORT PERRY REEL 2 - MS430

The Village of Port Perry was separated from Reach Township and incorporated in January 1872. Joseph Bigelow became the first Reeve of the new Corporation.

Over the next 12 years more than 200 by-laws were passed by elected representatives of the Village, but all of these were lost in a devastating fire which swept through the town and destroyed the entire business section.

Following the fire of July 4, 1884, the present day council, and succeeding councils set to work on the arduous task of re-writing and creating new bylaws with which to operate the town.

On the following pages are listed the first 50 years of by-laws for the Village of Port Perry, commencing July 9, 1884.

By-law 207

A by-law to amend the fire limit by-law and to make further provisions.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. That from and after the passing of this by-law no building shall be constructed of material other than such as the outer walls of which shall be of solid brick, stone or iron or partly of tow or more of such materials within that certain area described as follows: Water Street on the west side from Mary St. to Queen St.; Queen St. on both sides from Water St. to John St.; and Perry St.. on both sides from North St. to Mary St. or within one hundred feet of the limits of the said portions of streets within the said area.
- 2. No building of wood shall be constructed within thirty fee of any buildings that may be constructed within the said area, nor shall any of such last named buildings be carried or constructed to within thirty feet of any wooden buildings.
- 3. Wherever any wooden building shall be or hereafter be constructed upon any lots or part of lots fronting on the said parts of streets there shall be placed upon the outside of all windows and doors of any building that may be constructed in conformity with this by-law, and facing any such wooden building solid iron shutters or doors as the case may be.
- 4. No wooden building shall be in any way connected by wood with any such brick, stone or iron building.
- 5. Any building constructed in violation of this by-law shall be forthwith removed by the owner thereof upon notice upon behalf of this Corporation or by any ratepayer and in default the same my be removed under the direction of the council of this Corporation by any officer thereof who may be directed by resolution of council with such assistant and assistants as he may require and the costs thereof shall be borne and paid by such owner and in default of payment the same shall be charged against he lands upon which such building or buildings my be constructed and shall be collected in the same manner as other

municipal taxes.

6. The former by-law of the Corporation respecting Fire Limits is hereby repealed except only as to matters done thereunder or in violation thereof and for such last named purposes the said By-law shall remain in full force and effect.

Dated the 9th day of July 1884

(This by-law was passed five days after the fire which destroyed the entire business section)

By-law 208

A by-law to divide the Village of Port Perry into polling subdivisions and to perpetuate the by-law in that behalf destroyed by fire.

Whereas by reason of the destruction by fire of all the bylaws in force of this Municipality and no copies of any thereof being forthcoming it is necessary to re-enact the same. Therefore the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

1. There shall be three polling subdivisions in this village.

Number One Subdivision shall comprise all that portion of the said village lying between the lake on the east and following streets and parts of streets on the west, "commencing at the intersection of the eastern limit of Ontario Street with the southern limit of the Corporation thence north to Avenue Street, thence along the avenue to John Street, thence along John street to Perry Street, thence along Perry St. to Lilla St., thence along Lilla St. to the northern limit of the Corporation.

Number Two Subdivision shall comprise all that portion of the said Village lying west of Number One Subdivision and south of Queen Street.

Number Three Subdivision shall comprise all that portion of the said Village lying west of Number One Subdivision and north of Queen Street.

This by-law shall be read as the by-law passed in 1883 for like purposes and defining the same limits. Dated 18th July 1884

By-law 209

A by-law to amend by-law 207.

Section three of By-law 207 is hereby amended by inserting after the word "doors" where it last occurs in the said section, the words "or wooden shutters or doors covered with bright tin doubled around the sides and ends to a distance of at least four inches on the inside and nailed from the inside only so that the nails do not penetrate through the wood.

Dated July 18, 1884.

By-law 210

A by-law respecting livery stables, billiard and bagatelle tables and bowling tables.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

Livery Stables:

 No person shall keep any livery stable or horses, cabs, carriages, omnibuses, or other vehicles for hire within this Corporation without first paying on or before the first day of march in each year a License fee of \$25.00.

Billiards etc.:

3. No person shall keep for hire or gain directly or indirectly or have in his possession or on his premises any billiard or bagatelle table or bowling alley or shall keep or have billiard or bagatelle table or bowling alley in a house or place of public entertainment or resort whether such billiard or bagatelle table or bowling alley is used or not without having first paid therefor the annual license fee following, on or before the 1st day of March in each year.

For a single Billiard Table \$50.00
For each additional Billiard Table \$25.00
For each Bagatelle Table \$40.00
For each Bowling Alley \$50.00

4. Any person who shall contravene any of the provisions of this by-law shall upon conviction, by any one justice of the peace, forfeit and pay a fine of not less than \$10.00, nor more than \$40.00 and costs, and in default of payment the same shall be levied by distress and sale of his goods and chattels and in default of sufficient distress he shall be committed to the common gaol at Whitby for 20 days unless such fine and costs and costs of conveying same be sooner paid.

Dated 18th day of July 1884.

By-law 211

A by-law respecting Exhibitions, shows, etc. The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

1. No person shall exhibit within this Corporation any exhibition of wax works, menageries, circus riding and other such like shows usually exhibited by showmen until he shall have first paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation the license fee hereinafter required and imposed, that is to say:-

For exhibition of wax works and other such - like shows including shows commonly knows as side shows, per day \$10.00

For menagerie, circus and other such like shows, per day \$25.00.

2. Any person guilty of an infraction of this by-law upon conviction thereof by any one Justice of the Peace in the summary manner shall forfeit and pay a penalty of not less than \$5.00, nor more than \$40. - and costs., and in default of payment the same shall be levied of his goods and chattels. And in default of sufficient distress he has be committed to the Common Gaol of this County for 20 days unless such fine and the costs of imposing shall be sooner paid.
Passed July 18, 1884.

By-law 212

A by-law to define the height and description of lawful fences. The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. All board and picket fences shall be not less than four feet high with posts not more than eight feet from centre to centre. There shall be no space between the boards greater than four inches within two feet of the ground and none greater than six inches in the entire fence.
- 2. A wire fences shall be at least four feet high upon posts not more than 10 feet apart. There shall be no space between wires greater than 4 inches within two feet of the ground. There shall be a top board or scantling with one side board level with the tops of the posts.
- 3. All rail fences shall be at least four and a half feet high and the rails to the distance of two feet from the ground while not be more than 4 inches apart.

All other bylaws respecting fences are hereby repealed. Dated July 18, 1884.

By-law 213

A by-law to regulate and restrain the running at large of certain animals and to regulate pounds and poundage fees.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any horse, bull, swine, sheep, goat, cattle or poultry to run at large in this village except as hereafter provided.
- 2. All milch cows that are not breachy shall be allowed to run at large from seven o'clock in the morning to eight o'clock at night form the first day of May to the first day of December in any year.
- 3. There shall be one pound for this village and the same shall be the yard attached to the Town Hall.
- 4. Robert McKnight is hereby appointed pound keeper.
- 5. If not previously replevied the pound keeper shall impound any horse, bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, sheep, goat, pig, goose or other poultry distrained for unlawfully running at large or for trespassing and doing damage, delivered to him for that purpose by any person who has distrained the same. (more clauses on penalties and fines etc.)

Dated 18th of July 1884

By-law 214

A by-law respecting public morals within the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

Placards

No person shall post any indecent placards, writings or pictures, or write any indecent word or make any indecent picture or drawing on any wall, fence, street or public place within this Corporation.

Drunkenness

No person shall be drunk, or disorderly or profanely swear or use obscene blasphemous or grossly insulting language, or commit any other immorality or indecency within this Corporation.

Lewdness

No person shall keep any disorderly house or house of ill fame within this Corporation.

Gaming

No person shall keep any gambling house or have any farobank, rouge et noir, roulette table or other device for gambling within this Corporation. It shall be lawful for any constable or other peace officer or citizen to seize and destroy any farobank, rouge et noir, roulette table or other devise for gambling found within this Corporation.

Horse Racing

No person shall race or speed any horse on any street within this Corporation.

Indecent Exposure

No person shall publicly expose his person or make any other indecent exhibition within this Corporation. **Bathing**

No person shall bathe or wash the person in the water of Lake Scugog fronting on the limits of this Corporation between the hours of seven o'clock in the forenoon and nine o'clock in the afternoon. Any person who shall contravene any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to the penalty following:

For any offense under the first, second, fifth, sixth or seventy sections hereof, a sum not less than \$1.00 and not exceeding \$5.00 and costs.

For offense under the third or fourth sections hereof a sum not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$30.00 and costs.

All penalties imposed and collected hereunder shall be paid to the Treasurer of this Corporation. Dated 18th day of July, 1884

By-law 215

A by-law to appoint a Local Board of Heath for this village. The Corporation of Port Perry enacts as follows:

That the following persons shall compose a Local Board of Health for this village pursuant to the provisions of the Act 4/ that is to say:

- The Reeve and the Clerk respectively for the time being and G.H. Clemens, Physician, C.R. Henderson, Produce Dealer and Edward Major, Gentleman. *Dated 4th day of August 1884.*

By-law 216

A by-law to access and levy the whole rateable property within the Corporation of Port Perry, a sufficient sum for the payment of all valid debts of the Corporation whether of principal or interest falling due within the current year.

Whereas for the payment of all valid debts for the Corporation of Port Perry whether of principal or interest that may fall due within the year it will be necessary to assess and levy on the whole rateable property within the Corporation the several sums following, that is to say:

For High School \$1,255.00 For Public School \$1,860.00

etc.

And whereas the whole rateable property within the Corporation according to the last revised assessment rolls is \$378,395.00

And whereas for the purpose of aforesaid there will require to be levies etc.

(Detailed apportioning of the taxes in by-law)

Dated 2nd September, 1884.

By-law 217

A by-law to provide for the borrowing or the credit of this Municipality the sum of eleven thousand dollars to meet \$5,000 in debentures maturing 9th Sept., 1884 and for the purpose of purchasing a Shaw Fire Engine and other necessary fire apparatus and for the raising of the said sum by the issue of Debentures and providing for repayment thereof.

Whereas the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry deem it necessary and expedient to provide for the debentures amounting to \$5,000 maturing 9th September 1884 and to purchase a steam fire engine and the necessary fire apparatus for the use of the Corporation.

And whereas for the purpose of aforesaid it will require an expenditure of \$11,000 dollars repayable in 12 years.

And whereas it will require the sums hereafter set for to be raised annually by special rate, on all the rateable property within the Municipality for the payment of the said some of \$11,000 and interest. etc. (very long by-law) *Dated October 6, 1884*

By-law 218

A by-law respecting the Public Health by-law.

Whereas it is expedient to amend or repeal some of the provisions of the by-law appeceded to the Public Health Act of 1884, so far as the same are in force in the Municipality and to suspend the operation of other provisions of the said by-law.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry therefore enacts as follows:

Section thirteen of the said by-law is amended by striking out the words "the first day of July in each year" and substituting therefor the words "the first day of July in every second year."

Rule on of Section 14 is amended by substituting the words "the Board of Health" for the words "the medical health office" and by striking out the words "with the approbation of the board.

The following shall be added to Rule One, "no privy vault, earth closet or other receptacle for excretion shall be constructed within 20 feet of any street, nor within 30 feet of any well, nor upon, over adjoining or drained into any drain ditch, creek or stream within this Corporation. No receptacle for excretion shall be dug to a greater depth than four feet below the surface.

All privies and closets within or opening into any building shall have hinged lids to the seats to be kept closed and shall have two escape pipes, one starting from below the seat and the other from above, both carried up beyond the roof.

Rule Seven of the said section 14 is amended by striking out the word "seventy" and substituting the word "forty" and inserting after th word "house' the words "and 20 feet from any street."

Rule Eight is amended by substituting the word "four" for the word "two" and by adding thereto the words "and no manure shall be placed withing 20 feet of any dwelling house on street".

Rule Sixteen is herby suspended

Dated 1st September 1884.

By-law 219

A by-law to fix the places for holding the annual election of the members of the Council and to appoint Deputy Returning Officers, etc.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry therefore enacts as follows:

Th election for Reeve and Councillors for this Village for the year 1885 shall be held at the following named places and the persons named herein while be the Deputy Returning Officers respectively for hold such election.

For polling subdivision number one: Bewell's Implement Shop, Queen St.. Harris Burnham DRO For polling subdivision number two: the Town Hall, Edward J. Mundy DRO.

For polling subdivision number three: the frame School House, Rosa Street, E.D. Rogers DRO. *Dated 1st December*, 1884.

By-law 220

A by-law to appoint a Collector of Taxes and fix his salary.

Mr. A.P. Harrington appointed Collector of Taxes at a salary of \$50 per year. Dated December 1, 1884

By-law 221

A by-law respecting filth on streets, injury to property, obstruction of streets and for other purposes.

The Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. No person shall throw any dirt, filth, carcasses or animals or rubbish on any street, road, lane or highway of this Municipality.
- 2. No person shall injure or destroy nor tie any horse to any lamp post, tree or shrub planted or preserved for shade or ornament upon any street in this Municipality.
- No person shall pull down, or deface any sign, board or written notice lawfully affixed within this Municipality.
- 4. It shall be lawful for any constable or other peace officer to seize and remove all tainted and unwholesome meat, poultry, fish or other articles of food wherever and whenever exposed for sale within this Corporation.
- 5 No person shall erect or cooutinue? any slaughter house within this Municipality what shall be within fort feet of any public street or dwelling house within the Municipality and the occupants of every such slaughter house shall forthwith after slaughtering cause all remains to be buried and the floors to be washed and cleaned.
- 6. No person shall ring any bells, blow any horn, or shout or make any other unusual noise or noises calculated to disturb the inhabitants in any street or public place within this Municipality.
- No person shall fire any gun or other fire arm, nor fire, nor set off any fire ball, squib, cracker or fireworks in any street, road,, lane or alley withing this Corporation.
- 8. No person shall engage in any chivari or any other like disturbance within this Municipality.
- No person shall lead, ride, or drive any horse or cattle upon any sidewalk or other place not proper therefor within this Corporation.
- 10. No person shall encumber or injure any animals, vehicles or other means any road, street alley, lane or communication with this Corporation.
- 11. No person shall erect, put-on, place any doorstep, porch, railing, verandah, awning or other erection or obstruction or place or expose any goods or boxes so that the same shall project into, over or upon any

street, road or other public communication within this Corporation.

- 12. No child shall ride on the platform of any car or behind any wagon, sleigh or other vehicle and no person in charge of any such vehicles shall suffer or permit any child to ride behind the same.
- 13. No person shall ride upon any sleigh or toboggan nor skate upon any sidewalk upon any street within this Corporation.
- 14. No person shall leave any horse upon any street not in charge of some competent person, or not properly tied to a post or ring.
- Any person who shall violate any provisions of this by-law shall be subject to the penalty following and costs.

For offenses under sections 12 and 13, not more than \$5.00 and not less than \$1.00 For offenses under any other section, not more than \$20., nor less than \$1 upon conviction before any Justice of the Peace to be made and levied in the manner provided by law for offenses against bylaws. Dated this 8th day of December 1884

To appoint a collector to Poll Taxes.

That Robert McKnight be and he is hereby appointed collector of Poll Tax for the year 1884. It shall be the duty of the said collector to collect from all male residents of 21 years and upwards, not otherwise assessed, the sum of \$2.00 each as poll tax as imposed and required by law. - 1. That the weight scales at present erected on the east side of Water Street within this Corporation shall be maintained by the Council of said Corporation.
- 2. The council shall appoint some person to take charge of the Weigh Scales of this Corporation either as servant of the Corporation or as a lessee of the scales upon such terms and conditions as the council

shall from time to time by resolution determine.

- 3. The servant of the Corporation must give a bond with sufficient security.... Etc.
- 4. It shall be the duty of the person having charge of the said weigh scales to attend for the purpose of weighing any stock, grain, hay,live animals and other articles or merchandise requiring to be weighted on all lawful days from the hour of seven o'clock in the forenoon until the hour of six o'clock in the afternoon....etc.
- 5.Such party in charge of the weigh scales shall keep a book in which shall be entered the date of weighing and description of the article or merchandise....etc.

The lessee or person in charge of said weigh scales shall demand and collect the following fees viz:

For weighing a load of hay 15¢

For weight slaughtered meet or grain or other

articles exposed for sale under 100 pounds02¢

Over 100 pounds and up to 1000 pounds 050

Over one thousand pounds 10¢

For weighing live animals other than

sheep or pigs if more than five per head 03¢

And all fees shall be paid before entering the scales or weigh house.

The weigh scales shall be under control of the council and the party in charge thereof shall conform to the conditions of this By-law and also to all regulations which the council shall form time to time specify and the council shall at all times have the power to dismiss any person in charge without ...etc.

All fees and rents collected or paid by virtue of this by-law shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Corporation in quarterly payments and shall form a part of the revenue of the Municipality. (long by-law, not full text)

All bylaws and parts of bylaws inconsistent herewith shall be and the same are hereby repealed. Dated January 16, 1889

By-law 360 - To Appoint a Solicitor for the Village of Port Perry

That Frank M. Yarnold be and his is hereby appointed Solicitor for the Village of Port Perry. *Dated May 1, 1893*

By-law 361

A by-law for preventing and for removing or regulating the construction of any chimney, flu, fireplace, stove, oven or other apparatus or thing which may be dangerous in causing or promoting fire and for regulating the construction of same, etc.

- 1. There shall not be constructed withing this Corporation any chimney, flue, fireplace, over, stove, boiler or other apparatus or thing which may be dangerous in causing or promoting fire.
- 2. That any chimney, flue, fireplace, over, stove, boiler or other apparatus or thing which may be dangerous in causing or promoting fire shall be removed or regulated.
- 3. That all chimneys constructed within this Corporation shall be brick and shall project at least three feet above the roof and coated on the inside with plaster and shall be properly cleaned at least twice in each year, Spring and Fall.
- 4. That ashes shall be removed from buildings as soon as taken from the stove and if kept shall be placed in fireproof vessels, otherwise to be disposed at least twenty feet from buildings or fences.
- 5. That Robert McKnight be and he is hereby appointed Inspector of Premises to enter at all reasonable times upon any property subject to the regulations. Of the council in order to ascertain whether such regulations are obeyed or to enforce or carry the same into effect.
- 6. Any person violating any of the provisions of this by-law shall be subject to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars exclusive of costs to be recorded and enforced with cost by summary conviction before any Justice of the Peace for the County of this Municipality in the manner provided by law for offenses against bylaws.

It is hereby enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of Port Perry that from and after the passing of this by-law, no person shall keep or suffer to be kept any larger quantity than five barrels of coal oil, kerosene oil or other similar oils nor a larger quantity than two gallons of any crude oil, naphtha, benzine or other similar combustible and dangerous fluids at any one time in any place in the Village unless it or the building in which it is placed is at least 100 feet from any other building and any of the fluids secondly above enumerated, must be kept in metal vessels, this clause shall not apply to buildings which have been heretofore specially erected for the storage of coal oil.
- 2. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in or around any building within the Corporation at one time more than one empty coal oil barrel or other barrels which have contained illuminating oil.
- 3. No person shall have or keep any quantity of gunpowder, blasting powder or other explosive material exceeding twenty five pounds in weight....etc
- 4. No person shall enter any stable, barn, shed, carpenters or cabinet makers shop, nor any building within the limits of the Corporation where stray, hay, shavings or any combustible or explosive materials are kept or may be with a light not in a closed lantern, or with a lighted cigar, or pipe, and no person being in any such place shall, while there light any candle or lamp, match, cigar or pipe, now shall he have in his possession there any light to in a closed lantern, nor carry lighted cigar or pipe.
- 5. No person shall place any stove on a wooden floor unless the floor under such stove is wholly covered with tine, zinc, or other metal projecting at least twelve inches in front of the door of such stove and at least eight inches beyond the sides and back thereof.
- 6. No person shall discharge any gun or other firearms or set fire to any fire cracker, squib rocket or other fire works in or throw any fire fire cracker squib rocket or fire work into any of the streets, lanes or other public places with the Corporation aforesaid.
- 7. Any person violating any one of the preceding sections of this by-law shall be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar no more than twenty five dollars and costs and by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days in default of immediate payment of the fine and costs, but such imprisonment shall cease at any time if such fine and costs and all costs of imprisonment are sooner paid.

- That Village Engineers and workmen be authorized to construct as soon as it may be convenient a
 water tank on Silver St within 200 feet north of Queen St. and to lay mains and construct, erect and
 maintain all the necessary parts of the waterworks system along Queen St. from Lake Scugog to Simcoe
 St. passing under the railway in the manner provided by statue.
- 2. The town engineer be hereby authorized to install an Electric Light System in the Village of Port Perry and to set up poles and other electric light fixtures in the streets of Port Perry wherever necessary. Provided that all poles or fixtures put up for the Electric Light or whatever system of Port Perry shall be placed so as not to unnecessarily obstruct the streets or highways. Dated June 2, 1903

By-law 511

To appoint an Electric Light and Waterworks Engineer for the Village of Port Perry.

That Mr. Joseph Ward is hereby appoint as Electric Light and Waterworks Engineer for the Village of Port Perry at a salary of \$500. per year.

The duties of the said Engineer shall include everything pertaining to the proposed Electric Light and Waterworks system and may be more particularly limited or added to from time to time by resolution or by by-law of the Port Perry Council.

This Corporation shall use the Village Waterworks System, just installed including pumping station with its staff and equipment, mains and tank and nine hydrants installed from the station on the waterfront to the tank on Silver Street.

This Corporation shall pay to the Waterworks System the rate of \$50.00 per annum for hydrant commencing on 1st day of May 1904.

It is also enacted that the present fire engine shall be sold as speedily as may be done with advantage by the Fire and Light Commission.

That the personal of the Fire Brigade shall be charged by abolishing the office of Fireman and Engineer and by adding two more to the ordinary members of the brigade.

This Council enacts that the present incumbents of said offices to be: W. Corrin, Fred Smith, to hold office3 as Engineer and Fireman respectively as the end of present term. That the salary of the Chief be fixed at \$25.00 per annum and of the Captain at \$15.00 per annum.

By-law No. 568 - A By-law to regulate and restrain the running at large of certain animals and to regulate ponds and poundage fees.

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any horse, bull, swine, sheep, goat, cattle or poultry to run at large in this Village except as hereinafter provided.
- 2. All milch cows that are not breachy shall be allowed to run at large from six o'clock in the morning to eight o'clock at night from the 10th day of May to the 15th of October in any year.
- 3. Provided however that no milch cow shall run at large without wearing a Corporation Tag with its registered number for which the sum of \$1.00 shall be paid to this municipality annually. Such tags shall be obtained from the Village Pound keeper.
 - Subject to Section 237 of the Railway Act and any amendment thereto which partly reads as follows: (see by-law for details.)
- 4. There shall be one pound for this Village and the same shall be the south west corner of North and Perry St
- 5. Robert McKnight shall be and is hereby appointed Pound keeper.
- 6. If not previously replevied the pound keeper shall impound any horse, bull, ox, steer, cow, heifer, calf, sheep, goat, pig, goose, or other animals distrained for unlawfully running at large or for trespassing and

- doing damage delivered to him fro that purpose by any person who has distrained the same.
- 7. The following penalties shall be imposed (list of fines, eg: stud horses, bulls \$6.00; milch cows, sheep, goats, hogs, etc. \$1.00.)
- 8. No party shall milk feed cows on the public highway.

(a few more clauses in full by-law)

By-law 572 - A by-law to regulate and license the sale of Cigarettes and Cigarette Tobacco.

- 1. Every owner or keep of a store or shop (other than taverns and shops holding licenses under the Liquor License Act) where cigarettes or cigarette tobacco is sold by retail in the Village of Port Perry shall first obtain a License therefor from the Village Council of Port Perry This by-law shall take effect Jun 1, 1906
- 2. For such license the applicant shall pay the sum of \$100.00 per year to the Village Treasurer.
- 3. Such license may at any time be revoked by By-law of the Council without any reason given therefor but in such case a proportionate part of the License fee as will represent the unexpired portion of the business term shall be refunded to the licensee.
- 4. Any part contravening any provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a fine not exceeding \$50. and costs. In default of immediate payment said fine and costs shall be collected by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender; and if there be no distress fund out of which such fine and costs can be levied the offender may by committed to the County Gaol for a term of twenty-one days unless the fine and costs including costs of distress and committal and conveyance to Gaol are sooner paid. *Dated April 2, 1906*

By-law 574 - A By-law respecting the riding of Bicycles on Sidewalks.

(By-law No. 392 is hereby repealed)

Bicycles may be ridden on the sidewalks of Port Perry subject to the following conditions but not otherwise:

Pedestrians shall in every case have the right of way over anyone riding a bicycle and person on bicycles shall always dismount before meeting or passing pedestrians. On the sidewalks withing this Corporation any party guilty of any infractions of this by-law shall on summary conviction be liable to a fine of from \$1 to \$5 and costs.

Dated August 1906

(This by-law was repealed on September 10, 1906, and reinstated by-law #392)

By-law 577 - A By-law to authorize the execution of an agreement between the Bell Telephone Company Limited and the town.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. The Mayor and Clerk of the said Corporation are hereby empowered and authorized to execute in duplicate on behalf of the said Corporation agreement in the form hereunder set forth, which has been read at the present meeting between the Bell Telephone Company of Canada and the Town and to affix the Corporate Seal of the said Town thereto.
- 2. This By-law shall come into effect on and after the passing thereof.

By-law 589 - A By-law to authorize the issue of debentures of the Village of Port Perry to the amount of \$11,000 for the purpose of consolidating the floating debt of the Village of Port Perry.

Whereas the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry has incurred a floating debt amounting \$11,000, \$7,500 of which amount is on account of the Electric Light and Waterworks System; and \$3,500 of which is on account of permanent repairs to the roadways, sidewalks and on account of an old debt unprided for where the Village debts were consolidated in 1896.

And whereas the debt will be paid in five equal installments of principal and interest, commencing with the year 1915 during which item no principal shall be paid.

And whereas the said debentures shall be made payable in each of the years 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920 and so that the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest in any one year shall be equal as nearly as may be to the aggregate amount payable for principal and interest during each of the other four years of the period within which the debt is to be discharged.

And whereas the amount necessary to be raised during each of the five years 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919, 1920 is \$2,540. and whereas it will require the sum of \$550 to be raised annually for payment of interest until the year 1915 during which time no principal shall be paid.

And whereas the amount of the whole ratable property of the Village of Port Perry according to the last revised assessment roll is \$429,724.00.

And whereas the amount of the existing debenture debt of the Village of Port Perry is \$389,064.12, none of which is in arrears.

And whereas the issue of these debentures is authorized by the Village of Port Perry Debenture Act, 1902.

Therefore the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows: (details of pay back in remainder of by-law)

Dated August 1, 1907

By-law 590 - To regulate Wharfage Rates for the Village of Port Perry

Whereas the Village of Port Perry possesses a wharf at the foot of Queen Street and it is desirable to regulate the use of the same:

- 1. That the said wharf shall be opened to the public use as a wharf.
- 2. Provided that all parties using the said wharf shall pay the following rates:
 - for firewood, 10 cents per standard cord
 - for brick, 10 cents per thousand
 - for other commodities, 25 cents per wagon load
- 3. That three days be allowed for unloading and removal of and that an additional charge of 25 percent per day be made to the foregoing schedule for demurrage.
- 4. The Corporation Weigh master shall collect the dues, pay the same to the Treasurer and shall regulate the use of the wharf by the various parties and shall direct and control all matters relating to the piling or removal of obstructions or material on the wharf or as to where vessels shall moor.
- 5. That By-law No. 519 be repealed.

That all sections of any preceding by-law of this Corporation inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed. That any one may operate a Bowling Alley within this Municipality after obtaining a license therefor. That for such license shall be paid the following sums:

For the first alley per year \$15.00 For each subsequent alley per year \$10.00

That no such alley shall be operated in connection with a hotel or liquor store.

That all such Bowling Alleys shall be closed on week nights from 11 p.m. and shall remain closed until 6 p.m.

That all such licenses or any such license may be cancelled by the Council on the report of the town Constable that they are conducted in a disorderly manner and not in accordance with the by-law. "That if any such license be cancelled the license fee shall be returned pro rata. *Dated October 4, 1909.*

By-law 628 - A by-law to regulate and fix a license for Moving Picture Shows.

- 1. That any party before opening or starting a moving picture show within this municipality shall first obtain a license therefor from the Chief Of Police and shall pay therefor \$20.00 for a years license or for any part of a year.
- 2. That no person shall run a moving picture show in the 2nd storey of any building except Town Hall.
- 3. That no license shall be charge for a show operating in the town Hall. *Dated December 15, 1909.*

And whereas the Society have agreed to advance the said \$750.00 toward the purchase of the Old Fair Grounds on the condition that the said grounds are leased to them under the terms of the annexed agreement.

The Council of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. That the Reeve is authorized to collect the said \$750.00 from the Society.
- 2. The Reeve is direct to issue his order on the Treasurer in favour of William Tummonds for \$750.00 and to pay William Tummonds the \$750.00 received from the Society on the receipt of a deed to the Corporation clear of incumbrance of the said land, twenty two acres, more or less known as the Old Fair Grounds at the north west part of the Village of Port Perry bounded by Simcoe St., the Road between the Sixth Concessions of Reach, Bigelow Street, C.C. Kellett's property and the McArthur property.
- 3. The said sum of \$750.00 shall be assessed and levied against all the rateable property of this Village during the year 1910, and the Clerk is directed to enter the same in this years collector's roll. (Full detailed agreement included at the end of this by-law)

- 2. All Telegraph or Telephone Companies before erecting new lines on the streets shall submit plans of their proposed lines to the Council who shall approve of same before the lines are built.
- 3. All Telegraph or Telephone Companies shall erect their poles so as not to interfere or impede traffic and so as not to destroy or injure shade trees.
- 4. That the Franchise given herein be fore a period of five years, commencing 17th, October 1911. Dated March 28, 1911

By-law 659 - A by-law to appoint a Sanitary Inspector and to amend Schedule 'B' of Chapter 248, R.S.O.

All privy vaults, cell pools or reservoirs shall be cleaned out as often as they become foul or offensive. Earth closets shall be cleaned out during the summer time on or before the first day of May and at least once every two months until the first day of September, and as much after as they become offensive. It shall be the duty of the Sanitary Inspector to inspect each premise in this locality at least two times a year and to enforce all the provisions of the Public Health Act. The inspection to be once during the month of May and once during the month of August.

Samuel Graham is hereby appointed Sanitary Inspector for this Municipality at a salary of \$35 per year. The Inspector shall also be entitled to whatever fees may accrue to him on account of litigation.

The Board of Health shall meet twice a year after inspection.

The Board of health shall report to the Council after each meeting.

- 2. That John Hambly Brown is hereby appointed Treasurer of the Corporation at an annual salary of \$150 dollars for the Corporation business and \$100 dollars salary for the Electric Light and Waterworks to be apportioned according to actual time of his service.

- 2. A child found in a public place after nine o'clock unless so accompanied may be warned to go home by a Constable and if after such warning the child is found loitering in a public place, such child may be taken by the Constable to its home.
- 3. Every parent who having been warned permits his child to violate Section No. 1, shall incur a penalty of \$1.00 without costs for the first offense and for a second offense \$2.00 and for a third or any subsequent offense \$5.00.
- 4. The Municipal Council of the Village of Port Perry hereby appointed Arthur Thompson as a Special Constable to enforce the provisions of this by-law.

Nothing herein shall be construed to prevent any other constable from acting under the provisions of this by-law.

The said Arthur Thompson shall be paid at the rate of \$90 per year as a Special Constable under this bylaw. The appointment to terminate when notified by council.

By-law 700 - A by-law to authorize a certain agreement made between The Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario and the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Port Perry and other Municipal Corporation, for the construction, equipment and operation of an Electric Railway under "the Hydro-electric Railway Act., 1914."

(full by-law and a very long agreement in the bylaws)

This railway was to have a number of lines. The Whitby Sections was described as follows:

Line will leave Port Perry in the neighbourhood of the Fair Grounds and run direct to Manchester P.O., thence south to meet the Grand Trunk Railway near High point. Line will continue southerly a short distance west of the Grand Trunk Railway, passing about 1/2 mile east of Ashburn and thence through Lot 24 in the Township of Whitby to Brooklin.

Port Perry's debenture for its share of the railway was \$113,308.00 Dated and passed September 17, 1914

By-law 707 - A by-law to provide for the regulation of dogs running at large in the Village of Port Perry.

- 1. In this by-law the word dog shall include bitch unless a contrary intention appears.
- 2. No dog shall run at large within the limits of this Municipality unless the owner, possessor, harborer of such dog shall first cause to be registered, numbered described and licenses in the office of the Chief Constable and shall cause the dog to wear around its neck a collar, to which said collar shall be attached a metallic plate having raised cast or stamped thereon the letters L.P. (meaning License Paid) and the figures indicating the year for which said license has been paid and a number corresponding with the number under which the said dog is registered: and every such owner, possessor or harborer shall apply any such license metallic plate, and registration for each do the sum of one dollar and for each bitch the sum of two dollars.
- 3. No license shall be required for any dog less than three months old.
- 4. No person shall permit his or her dog to run at large, in the Village of Port Perry without having around its neck the collar and metallic plate mentioned in the 2nd sections of this by-law.

(12 clauses in entire by-law - see for detail)

Dated May 3, 1915

By-law 709 - A by-law to restrain cows or other animals from running at large within the Municipality of Port Perry.

- 1. No horse, cow, bull, sheep,pig including the male or female of each species shall be allowed to run at large within the limits of the Municipality of the Village of Port Perry.
- 2. Every animal so running at large shall be impounded and shall pay the fines and penalties embodied in the present village by-law.
- 3. By-law No. 568 shall be repealed in so far as inconsistent with this by-law otherwise it shall remain in force.

Dated June 14, 1915

By-law 712 - A by-law to regulate and restrain the running at large of certain animals and to regulate pounds and poundage fees.

Similar to previous by-law, only much more detailed - see for full details on restrictions, penalties, etc. *Dated September 9, 1915*

By-law 713 - A by-law to sell municipal lands to James Carnegie.

Whereas James Carnegie has undertaken to keep in order the west thirteen feet from front to rear of Lot 16 on the North side of Queen St. in the Village of Port Perry in parklike condition free of charge to this

Corporation on condition that the said lands be deeded to him.

Whereas the said lands are no longer required by this Corporation and it is desirable to grant his request. Now, therefore the Municipal Council enacts as follows:

That the Reeve and Clerk of the said Village of Port Perry are instructed to sign a deed of the said lands to James Carnegie for the price or sum of \$13.00 and to affix the Corporate seal thereof: Dated December 6, 1915

By-law 715 (a) - A by-law to provide for taking the votes of the electorate on a proposed by-law entitled By-law 715 of the Corporation to prohibit the sale by retail of liquor in the Village of Port Perry.

- 1. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Chief Constable of this Municipality, as such constable in addition to the usual duties of constable, it shall be his duty to maintain and lay information for infractions of the Village Bylaws.
- 2. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Tax Collector for unpaid taxes for the years 1912, 1913, 1914, 1915
- 3. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed caretaker of the Town Hall.
- 4. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Pound Keeper and shall collect all fees.
- 5. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed collector of dog taxes
- 6. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Sanitary Inspector under the Board of Health.
- 7. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Truant Officer and Special Constable under the Curfew Act.
- 8. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Road Commissioner for roads, sidewalks and streets.
- 9. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Special Officer to protect the town trees or shrubbery from lestruction
- 10. That William Nesbitt is hereby appointed Bread Inspector under the Bread Sales Act R.S.O. 224.
- 11. That the salary of William Nesbitt be \$9.50 per week and his appointment may be cancelled by resolution of the

Council given at any regular meeting, cancellation to take effect at the end of said month.

By-law 739 - A by-law to regulate the installation of Waterworks from the Village mains and Electric Lighting from the Village electric light system.

That no person shall interfere with or tap into water mains or add any further tap to the existing waterworks system of this Corporation whether on private property or on the streets. and no person shall tap Electric Light System or in any way interfere with the same or shall add any further lights thereto unless he has first obtained written permission therefor form the Village Treasurer.
- 2. That such permission shall only be granted on the condition that every such party shall agree to report to the Treasurer immediately after the construction or installation of water taps or electric lights in writing, full details of what work has been so completed.
- 3. That all persons therefor using the water from the Village mains or electric current from the Village electric Light System shall first enter into a written contract with the Treasurer for the use of same and the price to be paid.
- 4. That any parties interfering with or tapping the Water Works System or the Electric Light System without authority as before mentioned any parties using the water from the Village mains or electricity shall be regarded as trespassers and liable to the full penalties of the law for their actions.
- 5. The Village Treasurer is hereby authorized to prosecute all parties to offending or to take such other legal actions as may be expedient.

Dated March 2, 1917.

By-law 742 - A by-law respecting the traffic on the streets.

- 1. That all vehicles when brought to rest in the streets of the Village of Port Perry shall be so placed that the right side of the vehicle shall be against the curb or the side of the street.
- 2. That vehicles shall keep to the right side of the street.
- 3. That all vehicles shall approach the crossings slowly and carefully so as not to imperil pedestrians.
- 4. Where a vehicle meets another vehicle at a crossroad or intersection, the vehicle to the right hand of the other vehicle shall have the right-of-way. (Sec. 3 Highway Travel Act.
- 5. Notwithstanding any clause or Act as to the rate of speed at which a motor vehicle may travel any person who drives a motor vehicle in a highway recklessly or negligently or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the public shall be guilty of an offense under the Motor Vehicles Act.
- 6. Any one guilty of an offense under this by-law shall be liable to a fine of \$5.00 where not other penalty is provided under any Provincial Act.

By-law 752 - A by-law to form connections with the County Good Roads System subject to the approval of the County Council and the Minister of Public Works.

The said roads shall not be deemed to be assumed by the County or to form part of the County System of highways, but the purport of the by-law is to nominate such portions of highways in this Village and to confirm the designation of such highways under the by-law to be passed by the County Council of the County of Ontario by authority of Section 5 of the Highway Improvement Act.

That his Council hereby nominates that the following Village roads connect with Road No. 2 mentioned in the County By-law No. 863: Commencing at a point on the Reach Road on the south limit of this Corporation, thence along Ontario Street to Union Avenue, thence along Union Avenue north easterly to John Street, thence north along John Street/Queen Street, thence easterly along Queen Street to Perry St., thence north westerly along Perry Street to Lilla Street, thence northerly along Lilla Street to connect with the County Good Roads at the north end of the Village of Port Perry.

That this Council hereby nominates that the following roads connect with Road. No. 4 mentioned in the County By-law No. 36?: Commencing at a point on the west limit of this Corporation where the Good Roads System touches Port Perry at the intersection of Scugog Street and Queen Street thence along Queen Street to John Street where the road connects with County Road No. 2, thence along Road No. 2 to Perry Street sill on Queen Street, thence along Queen Street to Water Street, thence south along Water Street to Scugog Street, thence east along Scugog Street to the bridge. Dated February 7, 1918

By-law No. 753 - To appointed a Deputy Municipal Clerk for this Corporation.

That John Ford be and he is hereby appointed Deputy Municipal Clerk of the Corporation in addition to his previous appointed as Municipal Treasurer; as Treasurer of the High and Public School Boards; and as Treasurer of the Electric Light and Waterworks Systems. (duties outlined in by-law)

And that the said John Ford shall receive for his services for all duties of this Corporation including Trustee Board, the sum of \$550 per year with free office, heat and light.

By-law 762 - A by-law respecting Poll Taxes

That every male inhabitant of this municipality over the age of 21 years and under the age of 60 years who has not been assessed upon the Assessment Roll and not exempted by law from performing statute labour, shall immediately after the final revision of such roll, and not later than the first of July in each

year, pay to the Treasurer of this Corporation or the Collector of taxes the sum of five dollars. *Dated January 13, 1919.*

By-law 764 - A by-law to complete the purchase of the John Hambly Brown office building.

This Council hereby authorizes the purchase of the building, land and contents now used by the Treasurer, a deed of which was given in his lifetime and authorizes the Treasurer and the Reeve to pay for the said building, land and contents the sum of \$400.

Dated February 3, 1919.

By-law 765 - A by-law regulating the hours of closing of places of business for a limited length of time in the Village of Port Perry.

Whereas the Council have been petitioned to make provision for a hal-holiday during the summer and to fix hours for closing the shops and places of business in the Village of Port Perry from midnight April 27, 1919 until September 30th 1919.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

That all places of business within this Municipality shall close from the 27th day of April 1919 to the _____ day of ____ 1919 at the hour of five o'clock in place of the hour of six o'clock except on Saturday when the closing hour shall be 11 o'clock and better to accomplish this purpose all residents within this Village are recommended to move their clocks and timepieces ahead one hour.

All stores and places of business are directed to close from the first of July to the first of September at the hour of twelve thirty noon during Wednesday of each week.

Dated April 7, 1919.

By-law 766 - A by-law to provide a Quit Claim to Thomas Sintzel.

Whereas the Town purchase on the fourth day of May, A.D., 1903 the right to take grave from Seven Mile Island by 99 year lease.

And whereas it now appears that the gravel has been exhausted and that the pit is of no value to this Corporation.

And whereas it appears that the said land interferes with the sale by the present owner Thomas Sintzel Now therefore the Municipal Council of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

That the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry hereby instructs the Reeve and Clerk to sing a Quit Claim to Thomas Sintzel, owner of Seven Mile Island of said lease of gravel pin on Seven Mile Island. *Dated April 23, 1919.*

By-law 767 - A by-law regulating the measuring of coal.

Sale of Coal

- 1. Every coal dealer shall give to the driver or person in charge or each load of coal sent out for delivery to a purchaser in the Village, a ticket signed by such dealer specifying the name and address of the purchaser and the net weight of coal contained in such load.
- 2. In the event of coal being delivered to more than one purchaser, the dealer shall give one ticket for each order or quantity....etc.
- 3. The Chief of Police may require that any load of coal on its way from seller to buyer in the Village of Port Perry shall be weighed upon the weigh scales of the Corporation; or the purchaser of any load of coal may require the same to be so weighted before deliver.... etc.
- 4. No dealer shall falsely state in any ticket aforesaid the weight or amount of any load of coal sent out for delivery...etc.
- 5. Each coal dealer shall have on his premises a suitable weigh scales property tested and capable of weighting each quantity of coal sold by him.
- 6. Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay, at the discretion of the convicting Magistrate, a penalty not exceeding (exclusive of costs) the sum of \$50 dollars for each offense... etc.

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry enacts that: The Reeve and Clerk be and are hereby directed to execute the agreement now before the council. *Dated March 4, 1920.*

By-law 779 - A by-law to regulate the closing of shops and fixing holidays for shop keepers and their assistants.

Whereas the Council as authorized under sub-section 3 of the Factory Act, Revised Statues of Ontario, to make bylaws regulating the closing of shops and fixing holidays therefore the Municipal Council enacts as follows:

That all shops within this Municipality shall remain closed on Sundays and other Statutory Holidays saving exceptions provided by various acts.

That with the exception of weeks in which there is a Public Holiday, all shops shall close during the months of June, July, August up to and including the 15th day of September at 12:30 p.m. Wednesday afternoons.

That the Reeve may declare a Civic Holiday by proclamation once yearly.

That except as hereinbefore provided all shops shall close Saturday at at 10:30 p.m.

That any party acting in contravention of this by-law shall be subject to the penalty not exceeding \$50 to be imposed by the Police Magistrate.

That all other bylaws shall be declared void relating to the closing hours of shops. *Dated May 29, 1920.*

The Port Perry Rink Company undertake to furnish free skating for two hours on each Saturday afternoon during the skating season for the public, and the Corporation shall pay for such privilege an amount equivalent to the water used by the Rink from the town pumping station; and the electric light used by the Rink from the town electric lighting station, and the taxes, except school taxes, assessment for same not to exceed \$2,000, payable on the Rink property to the Village of Port Perry.

This agreement to be enforceable for a period of ten years, and to terminate 10 years from the date hereof.

It is understood that the light to be furnished shall be only supplied in accordance with the necessities of the lighting plant of the Village of Port Perry; and the electric light engineer shall have authority to say what light, if any, shall be furnished from time to time to the Rink Company. *Dated December 15, 1921.*

By-law 808- A by-law respecting the oiling of Queen Street from Water Street to Simcoe Street.

- 1. Queen Street in the Village of Port Perry from Water St. to Simcoe St. shall be oiled and the annual cost thereof shall be paid as follows: 30 per cent thereof shall be paid by the Corporation of the Village of Port perry and 70 per cent of the annual cost of oiling the above mentioned portion of Queen Street shall be specially assessed upon the lands abutting directly on such street, that is, on Queen St. from Water St. to Simcoe St., according to the frontage thereof.
- 2. The amount of the said special rate shall be entered on the collector's roll and collect in the same manner as other taxes.
- 3. This by-law shall remain in force from year to year until repealed. *Dated September 11, 1922*

By-law 810 - A by-law to provide a Dumping Ground for the Village of Port Perry and to regulate same.

That whereas a certain area lying to the east of the travelled road on Water Street and between Cinderella and Scugog Streets in the Village of Port Perry has hitherto been set aside and permission given to the public to dump refuse thereon of a non-objectionable character.

And whereas this road has not become a much travelled road and leading thoroughfare therefore it has become necessary in the interest of the adjacent property holder and in the public interest to discontinue this practice.

There the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

That on and after the publication of this by-law ti shall be an offense to deposit any kind of material, refuse, garbage or rubbish on aforementioned lands or within the area so described (except clean dirt or ashes under the direction of the Street Commissioner) under penalty of \$10 for each and every offense. And it is further enacted that an area be staked off at the north end of Water Street at the lake, adjacent to, but no on, the land of the Farmers Union Milling Co. upon which the public may deposit refuse. Provided however that nothing of an offensive nature or which may become a nuisance or dangerous or injurious to health be so deposited.

Than any person or persons violating this by-law by depositing or causing to be deposited any matter or material of an offensive nature as aforesaid shall be liable to a fine of \$10 and cost and the charges for removal of the said nuisance.

And it is further enacted that the Constable shall post placards on Water Street on the section hereinbefore mentioned warning the public of the withdrawal of the dumping privilege heretofore permitted and advising them of the imposition of the fine.

Whereas W.L.Parrish has by offer dated February 19 agreed to supply the said Corporation with a furnace upon the following terms at the price stated:

"I agree to install a furnace in the Town Hall with a capacity of 25 percent over total cubic contents of the building for \$320.00 and guarantee the furnace. The furnace is a New Idea No. 527.

And whereas it is the desire of this council to accept the said offer...etc.

By-law 823 - A by-law requiring the removal of certain lumber, wood, brick and rubbish on Water Street.

Whereas the Farmers' Union Milling Company have piled certain lumber, wood, brick and rubbish on Water Street opposite the land where the said company carries on operation.

And whereas the said lumber, wood, brick and rubbish is an obstruction on the said street and interferes with public travel and it is desirable that the same should be removed at once:

Therefore the Municipal Council of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

- 1. That the Farmers' Union Milling Company be and are hereby required to remove forthwith from Water Street the lumber, wood, brick and rubbish placed, deposited, or maintained on Water Street by the said Company opposite the land on which the said Company carries on its operation.
- 2. If the said Company makes default in removing the said lumber, wood, brick and rubbish, as directed by this by-law, the said lumber, wood, brick and rubbish, shall be removed by the Constable or some other officer or servant of the Corporation at the expense of the said Farmers' Union Milling Company and such expense may be recovered by the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry, either by action or in like manner as Municipal Taxes.

DAted April 9, 1923.

By-law 823 - A by-law to prohibit the obstructing and encumbering of highways.

- !. That no person shall construct or encumber any highway or bridge withing the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry by piling or depositing lumber, wood, brick, or rubbish thereon,, or by allowing such to remain piled or deposited thereon.
- 2. Any person convicted of a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall forfeit and pay at the discretion of the convicting Magistrate, a penalty not exceeding the sum of \$50 for each offense, exclusive of costs....etc.

Dated April 9, 1923

By-law 827 - A by-law to prevent the spread of noxious weeds.

That every occupant of land within the Village, or if the land is unoccupied, the owner shall cut down or destroy all the Canada Thistles, or ex-eye daisy, wild oats, ragweed and burdock growing thereon, and all noxious weeds growing thereon to which the Act may be extended by by-law as provided hereinafter, as often in every years as is sufficient to prevent the ripening of their seed, if such cutting or destruction does not involve the destruction of growing grain.

(long by-law - 15 clauses)

Dated July 3, 1923.

By-law 825 - A by-law to appoint an officer to enforce the Ontario Temperance Act.

That William Nesbitt be hereby appointed to enforce the Ontario Temperance Act in the Village of Port Perry.

Dated July 19, 1923.

By-law 830 - A by-law for restraining and punishing persons found drunk or disorderly or both in any highway, or public place in the Village of Port Perry.

- 1 That no person shall be drunk or disorderly in or upon any street, lane, highway, alley, common, vacant lot, public hall or room, or other public place in the Village of Port Perry.
- 2. Than no person on persons shall make use of any profane swearing, obscene, or grossly insulting language, or be guilty of rioting, riotous conduct, or indecency or disorderly conduct in or upon any street, highway, alley, lane, public hall, or room, hotel, or other public place in the Village of Port Perry, or exhibit, sell or offer for sale, any indecent or lewd book, paper, picture, drawing, photograph, plate, postcard or thing, or perform any indecent, immoral or lewd play in the said Village.
- 3. This clause deals with fines and penalties.

By-law 837 - A by-law for entering into a contract with the Canadian Allis Chalmers Co. for the purchase of a gasoline pumping outfit to be used for fire protection purposes.

Whereas the Council of this Corporation by resolution adopted at a meeting held on the 30th day of April 1923 authorized the Light and Water Committee to accept the tender of the Canadian Allis Chalmers Co. to supply and pump and gasoline engine to the municipality.

And whereas it is expedient to enter into a contract with the Canadian Allis Chalmers Co. for the purchase of the said gasoline pumping outfit.

Dated September 4, 1923

By-law 842 - A by-law to provide for the establishment of a public library

Whereas the Library Association of the Village of Port Perry at a meeting of said association held on the...... day of....., 1923 passed a resolution declaring it's desire that the library and assets of the Association be transferred to a Public Library Board to be appointed in the manner provided in the PUblic Library Act of 1920.

It is hereby enacted:

That a Public Library be established in the Municipality and that at the first meeting of the Municipal Council in 1924 that three members of the Public Library Board be appointed by that body, one of which will hold office until February 1st, 1925, one to hold office until February 1, 1926 and one to hold office until February 1, 1927 and thereafter the Council at its first meeting in each year shall appoint one member of the Public Library Board, said appointment to be for a term of three years. It is also enacted that the Clerk notify the Board of Education of the passing of this by-law and request that body to appoint three members to the Public Library Board at its first meeting in 1924, such members to be appointed in the same manner and for the same terms as those appointed by council. *Dated December 15, 1923.*

Whereas the Village of Port Perry is within that portion of the County of Ontario in which a system of County Roads has been designated and established:

And whereas it is desirable and necessary and expedient that roadway should be constructed on the streets herein mentioned in accordance with such regulations of the Department of Public Highways as may be applicable thereto, and such additional widths and curbs and gutters as may be hereinafter mentioned, under the provisions of the Local Improvement Act.

The work to be undertaken under an agreement with the County of Ontario shall be as follows:

- 1. Queen Street from the east limit to the west limit of Lilla Street.
- 2. From Queen Street on Perry Street, north to Lilla Street to the C.N.R. crossing.
- 3. Water Street from Queen south to the C.N.R. crossing, the said streets forming connecting links between Provincial County Roads Numbers 61 and 146.

Roads to be constructed in concrete - see Bylaws 848 and 849

(by-law details work to be undertaken)

Dated January 14, 1924

By-law 845 - A by-law providing for the removal of ice, snow and other obstructions form off the sidewalks in the Village of Port Perry.

That each and every person occupying or owning premises in the Village of Port Perry abutting upon any street or streets thereof shall from time to time and at all times remove and clear away all snow, ice, dirt and other obstructions from the sidewalk adjoining such premises.

In case any person or persons neglect for the space of 10 hours after the same shall have accumulated, to remove or clear away all such ice, snow, or dirt, or other obstructions, he or she shall upon conviction be subject to such penalty as the convicting Justice of the Peace or Magistrate may decided. *Dated January 14, 1924*

By-law 854 - A by-law to authorize the sale of Fresh Meat in less than quarters in the Village of Port Perry.

No sale of fresh meat in quantities less than 1/4 carcass shall be made within the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry except by persons holding a valid license, therefor the said license shall be procured from the Town Clerk and an annual fee of \$10 shall be paid therefore.

Any persons guilt of an infraction of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10. By-law to take effect from and after January 1st, 1925 Dated December 15, 1924.

That the said portion of Ottawa Street as stopped up and closed shall be and is hereby sold to the Board of Education of the Village of Port Perry for the sum of one dollar.



That he shall receive for his services the sum of \$26.00 per month payable the first day of the succeeding month.

By-law 928 - A by-law to fix the fees to be charged parties who retail milk or cream in the Corporation of Port Perry.

That all parties retailing milk or cream within the Corporation Limits shall pay a license fee.

That the fees charge shall be as follows:

All parties residing outside the Corporation shall pay a fee of \$5.00

A parties living inside the Corporation shall pay a fee of \$1.00

By-law 935 - A by-law authorizing an agreement with the Council of the County of Ontario, providing for wider pavements or other special construction on the County Road connecting link which is a portion of Queen Street in the Village of Port Perry.

That such roadway shall be constructed under the provisions of the Local Improvement Act on Queen Street, commencing at the west limits of Lilla Street to the westerly limits of Simcoe Street to a width of 20 feet, a distance of 2,360 feet, said street forming a connecting link with County Road No. 61.

The above street having a width of 20 feet, may have gravel shoulders to a width of three feet on each side of the pavement.

By-law 937 - A by-law to regulate the weighing of all coal sold to the residents of Port Perry.

All coal sold to residents of this Corporation must be weighed on the Corporation Scales.

That a fee of \$1.00 shall be charged the dealer.

Each dealer shall bring a statement showing the number of loads so weighed and check shall be paid to the Treasurer the beginning of each month for the previous month.

That in the event of any dealer failing to observer and comply with this by-law a fine of \$5.00 shall be imposed for the first offense and for the second offense and each succeeding offense a fine of \$10 shall be charged.

By-law 948 - A by-law to fix the speed limit in the Corporation of Port Perry.


The Speed Limit of motors or motor trucks and busses shall be 20 miles per hour and no more. That any person driving a motor car, or motor truck or bus at a greater speed than 20 miles per hour shall be liable to a fine of \$5.00 and costs and in case of nonpayment he shall be imprisoned in the County Jail at Whitby for a period of not more than 20 days unless sooner paid. *Dated April 7, 1930*

By-law 952 - A by-law to correct a clerical error in the boundary lines between George Hall's Pavilion property and the Power House property.

Whereas the surveyors Messrs Donevan and Smith show by a recent survey that the deed to this Corporation covers a small piece of land owned by George Hall.

And whereas it is desirable to correct the said error, the Municipal Council of the Village of Port perry instruct the Reeve and Clerk to execute a deed correcting the said error.

By-law 965 - A by-law appointed a Village Clerk and Village Treasurer, Hydro Electric Clerk and Treasurer of the Village of Port Perry, in place of E.H. Purdy, resigned.

The resignation of E.H. Purdy is accepted as of 21st, November 1931 at the end of his calendar month service. He will fulfill his duties until the new Clerk takes over the duties of the office and from that date until 21st November 1931 the said E.H. Purdy will instruct the new Clerk in the duties of his position according to the requirements of the clerk newly appointed.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of Port Perry further enacts that H.C. Nasmith be and is hereby appointed Village Clerk for the Village of Port Perry and Village Treasurer for the Village of Port Perry and Hydro Electric Clerk and Treasurer for the Village of Port Perry.

The duties of the new Clerk will be the same duties as have been performed by the past incumbent and at the same salary as the past incumbent, \$1,200. The duties of the new Clerk and Treasurer will be more definitely defined in a later by-law to be shortly passed. *Dated October 20, 1931.*

By-law 966 - A by-law to provide for the stopping up of Elgin Street, south from Queen Street and for the release of the said street so closed by the Village of Port Perry, to Beatrice M. Dix.

Whereas the hereinafter described land were laid out as Elgin Street upon a plan of subdivision filed in the Registry Office for the County of Ontario on February 23, 1852 by Reuben Crandell.

And whereas by reason of Section 13 of the Surveys Act it became a public street but which the municipality has never assumed for public use.

And whereas the said street allowance, if closed, shall belong to the owners of the lands abutting thereon.

And whereas Beatrice M. Dix is the owner of the land abutting thereon and is in possession and enjoyment of the said enclosed road allows and has applied to the Municipality to formally close the said street allowance and grant a quit claim of the said lands to her;

Be it therefor enacted that the Municipality be authorized to proceed in the name of but with no expense to the Municipality to close said street.....etc., described as follows;

Commencing on the south side of Queen Street at the north east corner of Lots 18 according to plan of Village lots laid out on Township Lots 17 and 18 in the 6th concession of the Township of Reach....etc. (full description in by-law)

By-law 976 - A by-law respecting the sale of cigarettes within the Village of Port Perry.

No person shall sell cigarettes by retail in stores or shops, other than Hotels holding license under Provincial Statute, without first having obtained a license therefor from the Village Treasurer. Such license shall run one year form the first day of January of the year in which it was issued. The license fee for each dealer shall be \$15 (later amended to \$10), annually but where a license is issued for the first time after July first the sum to be paid shall be \$5.00 to the end of the current year. The Council may, without stating any reason therefor, revoke any such license at any time whenever the Council deems such revocation desirable. The sale of cigarettes to persons under the age of 18 years shall be considered a sufficient cause for cancellation of such license.

By-law 986 - A by-law respecting Billiard Tables and Bowling Alleys

No persona shall keep for hire or gain directly or indirectly, or have in any public premises and Billiard Table or Bowling Alley without having first paid therefor a license fee as follows:

For each Billiard Table \$15.00 For each Bowling Alley \$10.00

Such license shall be effective to December 31st of the current year, but for any license taken out for the first time after July 1st the fee shall be \$7.50 for the remainder of the year.

By-law 1000 - A by-law to regulate the installation of water-works, to fix rates and provide for the collection of such rates for the Corporation of Port Perry.

Whereas the Village of Port {Perry has in operation a water-works system and does supply water to customers or water takers, deem it expedient to determine and fix certain rates and rentals for water and apparatus supplied by the Corporation, and provide for collection of such rates and to regulate the use of such water.

Dated September 15, 1933

By-law 1001 - A by-law for borrowing the sum of \$4,000 to extend the water mains of the Village of Port Perry.

Whereas it is expedient to borrow for the purpose of extending the water mains for the Village of Port Perry and for increasing the fire protection appliances the sum of \$4,000 and that is the amount of the debt intended to be created.

Therefor there shall be borrowed on the credit of the said Corporation the sum of \$4,000 and debentures shall be issued thereon on the installment plan in sums of not less than \$1.00 each.

Dated November 8, 1933

By-law 1002 - A by-law exempting the business tax of the Sebert House in the Village of Port Perry.

Whereas Section 140, Chapter 257, R.S.O. provides that the Municipal Council may by By-law grant a standard hotel total or partial exemption from municipal taxes, except school and local improvement taxes;

And whereas the Sebert House is a standard hotel, and the Council deems it expedient to exempt the said property from business tax.

Therefor the Municipal Council of the Village of Port Perry enacts as follows:

The Sebert House shall be exempt from business tax commencing January 1, 1934 and shall continue until this by-law is repealed.

Dated December 5, 1933.

By-law 1003 - A by-law for granting a fixed assessment to the Swan land and building while used as a boot and shoe factory.

1. For the purpose mentioned in the preamble, the following property, that is to say; The Swan building and land on the north-east corner of Mary and Perry Streets, Port Perry, while used as a boot and shoe factory shall be assessed at not more than the sum of \$100. during the period of ten (10) years from the 31st day of December, 1933: (not including school rates and local improvement taxes). Agreement in part

That William Merlin Letcher has established a factory for the manufacture of boots and shoes in the Swan Building on Perry St. and that he agrees to continue said business fro year to year and to keep employed a minimum of ten hands during at least eight months in each year.....etc.

By-law 1009 - A by-law for licensing, regulating and governing Hawkers, Pedlars and Petty Chapman.

No Hawker, Pedlar or Petty Chapman or other person carrying on a petty trade or who goes, from place to place or to other men's houses, on foot or with any animal, vehicle, boat, vessel or other craft bearing or drawing goods, wares or merchandise, for sale, shall do so or carry on his trade or business within the Municipality unless he shall have obtained a license so to do.

That the fee to be paid for the license shall be Five (\$5.00) dollars.

Dated March 5, 1934

By-law 1017 - A by-law for taking the votes of the Electors on the following question: "Are you in favour of authorities being issued for standard hotels wherein beer or wine may be sold under the Liquor Control Act?"

Whereas a petition has been presented to the Council, signed by 25 percent of the total number of persons appearing on the last revised list of the qualified voters praying that a vote be taken in the municipality at the earliest possible date to ascertain if the electors are in favour of authorities being issued for the Standard Hotels wherein beer or wine may be sold under the Liquor Control Act. That the votes of the electors of the Corporation of the Village of Port Perry shall be taken.....etc. On the 15th day of December A.D., 1934, at the hour of ten o'clock in the forenoon, the head of the Council of the said Corporation,or some member of said Council....etc. shall appoint a manager to act on behalf of those interested in obtaining an affirmative vote to the question herein, and a manger to act on behalf of those interested in obtaining a negative vote to the question herein.

On Tuesday, the 8th day of January 1935, in the Clerk's office, the Clerk shall attend and sum up the votes given for and against the proposed question.

By-law 1022 - A by-law for granting a fixed assessment on the Port Perry Milling Co. land and buildings while used for milling purposes

Whereas it is expedient in the interest of the Municipality to grant the fixed assessment hereinafter mentioned for the promotion of a Milling Industry in this Municipality.

1. For the purpose mentioned:

"in the Village of Port perry, in the County of Ontario, being part of Lots 124, 125, and part of Water Lot B on the east side of Water Street, now assessed to J. "Birkett: shall be assessed at not more than the sum of \$1,200 during the period of five years.

Dated December 12, 1934

(This by-law passed by a wide margin with the electors casting 224 in favour and 5 against)
